

### English Section

A qualified teacher (holding teaching certificates required to teach in an EU country), preferably with experience of teaching in a European School or in the international arena, you adhere to the philosophy of Jean Monnet who defines the European Schools mission as:

*"Students are mixed together, free from the youngest age of divisive prejudices, initiated to the beauty and the values of varied cultures, they are aware, whilst growing-up, of their solidarity. Whilst holding on to their love and pride in their nation, they become, through the spirit of being Europeans, well prepared to achieve and consolidate the job begun by their forefathers of a united and prosperous Europe."*

You will teach in **English**, your native language, however, your master of French will allow you to consult with your non-Anglophone colleagues and meet as necessary with the parents of your pupils. The harmonization of work between language sections as a part of the school project, as well as the active participation of parents in the school, is indispensable. Teaching in the **nursery section**, you will have experience of teaching children between 4 and 6 years old, which you will know how to use for the benefit of the nursery school's objectives:

- prepare children for a happy, healthy, responsible, and successful life;
- develop children's personality and abilities;
- support children's learning potential;
- build up respect for others and the environment;
- respect and appreciate children's own cultural and social identity, its values and those of others;
- promote a European spirit.

The themes that will be worked on include:

- The child and his or her body
- The child as an individual
- The child and others
- The child and the world

Teaching and learning in the early years supports and monitors children's physical and psychological wellbeing, including social, cognitive and emotional development and helps to prevent any difficulties that may arise by creating the best possible learning opportunities.

Your position will be based at the European School of Strasbourg, where you will teach for 25 ½ hours weekly, split over 5 days, 180 days per year, as well as time required for playground duty and reception, team meetings (follow-up of pupils' individual progression, setting up of shared pedagogical projects), and meetings with parents. You will be under the pedagogical authority of the Head teacher responsible for the nursery and primary school.

Your commitment, your ability to adapt to the European School system and your potential for training will be decisive. Also, you will benefit from help, training and the structure necessary for your professional progression. Your performance will be followed and evaluated regularly using the system set by the objectives and content of the European School curriculum.

- last evaluation or inspection report;
- letter of motivation;
- detailed curriculum vitae;
- photocopies of certificates.
